



2 year Funded Research MSc in Food Science

The Food Science and Nutrition group at UCD Institute of Food and Health is seeking an MSc candidate to join a Food for Health Ireland (FHI) funded project. FHI unites world-class academic research with industry vision for the potential of successful market innovations.

The project focuses on the use and development of techniques to characterise milk proteins and hydrolysates with appetite modulating properties (in collaboration with UCC). The MSc candidate will also examine the physico-chemical stability of ingredients with appetite modulation potential and the production of novel milk bioactive peptides using plant proteases.

This is a research-focused role in which the appointee will conduct a specified programme of research supported by training and development under the supervision and direction of Dr. Jacquier.

Further information:

Applicants should have a Bachelors (Hons) degree in Food Science, Chemistry, Food Technology, Chemistry or in a related subject and should have an interest in food and nutrition research. The MSc programme is for two years and the candidate will be paid a stipend (Euro 24,000 p.a. of which fees of approx. 7,350pa (EU citizen) and 14,135pa (non-EU citizen) need to be paid).
